Since 1986, Mark has focused on connecting partners with community-transforming projects in conjunction with faith-based organizations focused on higher education, media, church and worldwide missions. The Seed Company's mission is to accelerate Scripture translation and impact for people without God's Word through Great Commission partnerships, such as the "Alliance for the Unreached."

Mark began his focus on outreach ministry while serving at Cedarville University in Ohio, where he was instrumental in building a 14-station Christian radio network in the Midwest. He then formed the Major Donor Consulting division of Advocace, a faith-based management and educational support firm for ministries in Coppell, TX.

In his work with such organizations as the Christian Leadership Alliance and National Religious Broadcasters, he has engaged with hundreds of thoughtful Christian stewards and ministry leaders. Serving in leadership roles with the Seed Company since 2011, Mark engages individual, business and church partners as they invest in Bible translation for those without Scripture in 90 countries.
